5. Apiary Management, arrangements and equipment:

Nick reported that Stewart Beattie had told him the state of the apiary was a disgrace and there was general agreement that something needs to be done.

Equipment: New frames and foundation are needed.

A general clean up and disposal of poor equipment needs to be organised.

Nick, Pete and Syd are prepared to clear out the shed and in the new season Shook swarm the hives onto new frames.

Members need to be responsible for keeping the sheds tidy.

Dieter thought that it may be better to have one type of hive only at the apiary, but others felt it was important to be able to demonstrate different hive use.

It was proposed that a rota be drawn up to look at all hives in the non club meeting weeks, involving new members.

Syd advised that hives used to be numbered and all hive parts were numbered to avoid cross contamination.

Robin is willing to label hive parts.

There are 5 hives at present.

After a long discussion it was proposed that there should be team leaders and teams responsible for one month at a time, to all the checking of hives in the non apiary days. Stuart feels it is important to involve new members in the teams.

Possible team leaders would be: Nick, Syd, Mike, Charlie, Walter.

It is also important that the grass is kept cut at the apiary.
